It is awarded to one who has been conspicuously involved in the breadth of College life and who has earned the esteem of his contemporaries and teachers. The Insignis is a person who is large-hearted, generous, acts on principle, showing promise to build up God's kingdom on earth by inspiring and influencing the companions with whom he labours.

The recipient of this year's Insignis is a student who is known for being an outstanding and well-rounded student. During his time at the College, he has received many merit certificates for application to his studies. Not only is he committed to his studies, he has been a dedicated and passionate sportsman. He is universally admired and respected by staff as well as both older and younger students alike. He is known for his self-effacing manner and his humility. He is person who is kind and compassionate with a number of different passions.

Faith and service are important to this student. He was a peer minister in Years 10 and 11, assisting with the Years 7 and 9 Days of Reflection. This student has been involved in many different aspects of the College's co-curricular program including basketball, rugby union and debating. For the last two years he has been a member of our 3rds Basketball team and this year he was a member of our undefeated 9ths rugby team.

This student is a confident and gifted public speaker. Throughout his time at the College he has been a dedicated to our Friday night debating program. For the last two years he has been a member of our GPS First Debating team. This year, he was also selected as a member of the GPS representative Debating Team and a member of the NSW Debating Team. He also represented the College in Mock Trial last year.

This student was the Proxime in Years 5, 6, and 9. In year 9 he won the Industrial Technology – Wood Prize and the Principal's Prize for Writing.
